The closing event of the 2024 project "Litvaks' Literature on the Theatre Stage" in Baisogala On 15 November, the Baisogala Cultural Centre in Radviliškis district hosted an event for representatives of schools participating in the project "Litvaks' Literature on the Theatre Stage." As part of the project, students and their teachers read works by Lithuanian Jewish Litvak writers and later staged miniperformances. A total of 10 Lithuanian schools took part in the project, and 5 of them presented their productions at the final event in Baisogala. The students performed plays based on the works of writers Yitzchok Mer, Grigoriy Kanovich, Abraham Sutzkever, and the diaries of Yitzchok Rudaševski and Matilda Olkinaitė.

Among the guests were the Mayor of Radviliškis Municipality, Kazimieras Račkauskis, the Ambassador of the State of Israel, Hadas Wittenberg Silverstein, representatives of the Jewish community of Šiauliai County, school principals and teachers from various tolerance education centers in Lithuania.
